

Your Story, Your Legacy

How Elsie Balfour Became an

"Adopted Newfoundlander"

Elsie (Fletcher) Balfour was born into a large family of ten children and grew up near Ottawa's Byward Market.



Her family may not have been wealthy, but her parents found a way to provide for them all, and the children learned the value of hard work and honesty. These values would come in handy to Elsie later in life during her career with Birks Jewelers. Above all, Elsie remembers that she and her siblings knew they were loved.

Her career at Birks Ottawa started with an entry-level position. Birks is one of the oldest and most successful jewelry stores in Canada. Established in 1879 in Montreal, it later expanding to a series of stores nation-wide. Before long, Elsie's conscientious attitude, her dependability, and her people skills (both with colleagues and customers) became evident. She was promoted to more responsible positions, eventually becoming the manager of both the Billings Bridge and St. Laurent stores.

Later in life, through mutual friends, Elsie met Bob ("Rory") Balfour, a widower and a WW2 army veteran who had become a career military officer. His first wife Jean and two of his children also had military careers. Rory's army photo can still be found on the Ravine's "Veteran's Photo Wall" downstairs. Something must have clicked, as they decided to get married. Overnight, Elsie pivoted from being a single career woman to becoming a wife with four stepchildren and later 5 grandchildren.

Of all of Rory's personal qualities (and there were many), perhaps the most attractive to Elsie were his Newfoundland roots. At one point, she asked if they could take a vacation to Newfoundland (a place Elsie had never visited) so that she could see where her husband grew up. Little did she know that during that vacation they would discover that they both loved Newfoundland. Elsie recalls seeing a house for sale in Pasadena (near Corner Brook) and talking to the next-door neighbour Sam Major. The Majors treated them like family (as Newfoundlanders are known to do - "Come from Away" 9/11), offering a meal and a place to stay overnight. Elsie and Rory decided on the spot to settle there.

She would say later in life that those were some of the happiest years of her life. She admired the people she met, the hills, the ocean, the pace of life. The Majors and many others would become life-long friends. Bill Hann (a boyhood friend of Rory's) made sure that during their visit they stayed at the Glynmill Inn he owned, where they were treated "like VIPs". Elsie also admired nurse Myra Bennet, who came to Newfoundland in the 1920s for "two years", only to stay for fifty -- serving as a nurse, dentist, doctor, and veterinarian to the local people.

Is it any wonder that Elsie became an "adopted Newfoundlander", and one of the island's most passionate promoters? No doubt the Newfoundlanders she met feel the same way about Elsie.
